Just a little bit of heaven, are the words I would use to describe Ten Steak & Sushi. A perfect place for dining with friends or family, where steak and sushi come together to create a wonderful burst of flavor on the tip of your taste-buds.

The large brick walls surrounding the building with a giant glass window, looked vague and boring, but when I stepped into the building it was like walking into a whole new world. A variation of seating arrangements. A beautiful, large round vase with long flower stems shooting up and draping down right above your heads. The vase standing in the middle surrounded by four 90° booth seats each a different pattern, polka dots, and swirls, and zig zags, Oh my!

The menu has a large variety of all different types of foods. We started off with Edamame (\$5.99), warm green soy beans sprinkled with salt with a fancy orange peel arranged on top of a bead of soy beans. The first item ordered was the Chef's Cardini's Great Caesar (\$8.99). An extraordinary salad with croutons, and parmesan cheese. My family shared a sashimi platter with, two pieces of tuna, salmon, yellowtail, and sea bass (\$22.96). An exquisite display of fish on a large wooden boat with a flower of ginger on the side. We all shared a Rainbow Roll (\$11.99) a California Roll wrapped with Salmon, Tuna, and Eel topped with sweet eel sauce. A delectable roll for sushi lovers.

The dishes were cleared before I knew it and our entrees were ordered and had bits and pieces of each other's meals. I ordered the Tuscan Veal Chop (\$34.99) which was topped with delicious mushrooms, arugula, graded parmesan and a hint of truffle oil. I had a small sampling of the N.Y. Sirloin Steak (\$35.99) with a choice of brandy cream sauce, hollandaise sauce, béarnaise sauce, mushroom wine, and blue cheese butter, that absolutely melted in you're mouth. I also had a bite of the Pan Seared Sea Scallops (\$29.99) which was an absolutely delicious combination of smoked bacon, potato gnocchi, and a pea puree. I had a side order of the parmesan Truffle Frites (\$5.99) a scrumptious blend of fries with parmesan cheese baked to perfection.

The food was impeccable, but it wasn't finished. The desert menus came to our half circle booth. the waiter handed us 3D glasses we put the goofy look lenses on our face and looked down at the menu, which of course was 3D. I looked at all the choices they looked so real I just wanted to reach in the menu and eat all of them. I ordered the Chocolate Molten Lava Cake, my all time favorite. Time had passed and the lava cake got to our table. It was a chocolate cake filled with warm oozing chocolate, sprinkled with little bits of sugar with a scoop of vanilla ice cream in a small cup, arranged with a delicious looking strawberry sliced into multiple pieces. Once you break one of the walls with your spoon the chocolate creates a running pathway onto the plate. Top a little bit of ice cream on the top and you're good to go! The restaurant even had free valet parking!
